



Good teat conformation. Evenly spaced. All teats appear normal sized and placed and healthy, as if each one would function properly .

Please note 12 normal, healthy teats are required for registration. The two teats on the inner thighs in this picture can-not be counted. They would not function. More teats **does not** mean their litters will be larger in number. The teats should be evenly spaced to assure room for the glands to produce milk, and to assure each piglet has room to nurse.

Teats are an inherited factor. The boar teat count, placement, and health is also important even though they are not used for nursing.

A minimum of 12 healthy, evenly spaced teats will assure the average sized Red Wattle litter will be able to nurse comfortably.
